A message from Dominic....

Dear Orchestra,

I thought I would write a quick note to everyone to say What a FANTASTIC concert we gave the other week! I know at least two weeks now have passed since the show but I still have a lot of the Rachmaninov going through my mind. We pulled it off.....and we all know it is a difficult piece! Well done everyone.....we should pat ourselves on the backs! I enjoyed it immensely. I know I like to dwell on ensemble but it's worth saying we really were tight a great deal of the time. But one of the things that sticks in my mind is the way we phrased the big long tunes; the highs and lows came and went so fluidly, and the ends of phrases were delightful. We were unanimous and I think it came across well. A lot of the big chunky rhythms (like in the 4th movement for example) were punchy and accurate too. It gave it tremendous energy and life....fantastic! The Sibelius was good too I thought and beautiful solo playing from Fmma!

Lastly, I just want to mention the February concert coming up next: the programme is really really good. I can't recall the Elgar right now but I know the concert will be quite a challenge. Stravinsky is always quite difficult and Debussy is usually much harder than it sounds, being transparent, subtle and exposed. The thing is, we all know we have produced some good concerts lately....there is a lot we seem to be doing right, playing/phrasing really together of course being the main thing (as ever!); all of which is very exciting. What about we work from what we have already and make the next show something to remember?!

With this in mind and with a wish to play even more integrated as one, can I please make an appeal....that everybody tries to make it to ALL the rehearsals! I know it is sometimes not possible to do so but it is so important that we all try to.
