Congratulations to everyone for a tremendous performance of Mahler 2. I think it really was an unforgettable experience for everyone who took part, choir and orchestra - we really did ourselves proud. As Matt said afterwards it was a real performance not just a play-through.

Apart from the EDP review, we have been inundated with tributes from concert-goers thrilled by the performance. Chairman Caroline Jarrold was accosted by a stranger on the London train raving about the concert, and Keith Hobday tells me he has had "so many people come in to the shop to congratulate the Society on staging the occasion, including three men I've never seen before shaking me by the hand across the counter. One gentleman had seen Mahler 2 with Klemperer in the 1960's ('past his best') and at the opening of Symphony Hall in Birmingham with Rattle ('pretty stunning'). He went on to say he enjoyed our Mahler more than those!!!!"

Here are some of the comments from the survey forms which were completed on the night: 'Fantastic'; 'Good playing excellent Mahler'; 'Passion'; 'Impressive co-ordinated playing & performance'; 'Having only heard this symphony on CD/Radio it was thrilling to hear it live'.; 'Ambitious'; 'so exciting!'; 'Professional'; 'V. good performance'; 'Generally well played with good dynamics'; 'An excellent performance by all participants!'; 'A tremendous work, brilliantly performed'; 'Blending together of all the force.'; 'Magnificent sound.' And one respondent did not fill in any of the questions at all but wrote in very large letters across the whole sheet: "BLOODY MARVELLOUS! MORE PLEASE!"

so with performers as talented and enthusiastic as the Norwich Phil. I am honoured and delighted to be appointed as the orchestra's new Principal Conductor. We are looking forward to collaborating on some exciting programmes in coming seasons that will rival the quality (and perhaps the spectacle!) of the Mahler, and continuing the Phil's 170-year contribution to the musical life of the city."

Chairman of the Norwich Philharmonic Society, Caroline Jarrold said: "We are very fortunate to secure the services of a young conductor who is not only very gifted but who has already established such a terrific rapport with the orchestra. I know our audiences can expect some wonderful music-making in concerts and seasons to come."

What you didn't know about the Mahler concert

"One or two minor hiccups that I didn't really tell anyone about included the lights we hired kept shorting out! St Andrews Hall only has a 'domestic' electric circuit and every time we switched the lights off, they would not come back on again! The Hall staff had instructions to crawl underneath the stage during the performance and throw the switches if the lights shorted! Also, the stage did not have enough legs, so we had to 'improvise' a bit...."
