Welcome to the latest edition of Music in Norwich and Norfolk.

I am amazed to realise that it is 20 years since I started the publication as a way of music organisations working together to co-

promote and to avoid clashes of programming and dates. It was originally funded by the Arts Council for two years but quickly proved popular and continued, funded by the groups paying for the pages they occupy. From each page price, a proportion goes towards the 'common' pages, the calendar, cover etc and the more money in the pot, the more are printed. Organisations also help with distribution and so it is a truly collaborative publication, though I admit I have to do a lot of rounding up to get the info on pages and off to print - but it works!

Distribution is a bit harder than it used to be, so there is now a Music in Norwich by Post facility. For the price of a stamp and an envelope you can order a copy for yourself or extra copies for few friends. If you can help with distribution in your local area please get in touch as it really helps to have a good spread of distributors across the county.

St Peter Mancroft Church is a central place to pick up copies of Music in Norwich & Norfolk following the closure of the Tourist Information Centre. Norwich Cathedral serves the north of the city (The Halls is closed for a year from 2 January 2024). Arts Roundup racks around the city and county are also vitally important to arts info distribution.

There has been a re-launch of Arts Roundup information service. If you can accommodate a rack or if you have printed materials to get out to audiences across Norfolk, please get in touch at www.whatsonnorfolk.co.uk.

This publication covers venues across Norfolk and includes the King's Lynn Festival in the west and Great Yarmouth Arts Festival in the east. Diss Corn Hall in South Norfolk also has a wide range of concerts, classical, folk, jazz and world music. In north Norfolk, the Yorke Trust has a series of concerts in a chapel in South Creake to support young musicians who have suffered a lack of performance opportunities through the pandemic and are fund-raising for repairs to their building.

It is a sad season for Norwich Phil as their conductor David Dunnett has decided to retire. It will be a great loss for the Phil but he is going out in style with a final, celebratory concert conducting Elgar's *The Kingdom* on 4 November, see page 44.

Over the border in Lowestoft, The Pakefield Singers are performing at a fundraising concert for the Britten as a Boy statue (page 49) and the East Point Pavilion hosts music nights on the most Easterly point of England, see page 20.

There is a wider range of venues this season as The Halls will close for restoration. St Peter Mancroft and Norwich Cathedral will be taking many of the regular bookings while it is closed. The Cathedral is also celebrating the renovation of its organ with a series of recitals, plus collaborations with Norwich Baroque.





Rouen Seine Normandie 2028

In summer 2022, Norfolk was visited by two representatives of the Rouen Seine Normandie Capital of Culture bid – Jean Gabriel Guyant, the head of culture for Rouen and Rebecca Armstrong, Rouen 2028 bid lead.

Rouen in Normandy is twinned with Norwich, Norfolk and this made Norwich a natural partner for their bid to be European Capital of Culture 2028.

They came to open the door, across Norfolk, for a two-way relationship to enable both regions to develop projects, events, festivals, residencies and more over a ten year period.

They asked Norwich City Council to sign a manifesto of collaboration which they could include in their bid proposition.

They met with cultural leaders across the county, asking them to always think about what opportunities there could be to work together when planning projects.

In December 2022 Rouen will know if it is one of the short-listed cities in France. They are up against strong competition. If they are shortlisted they will go forward to a full bid. THE HALLS COMPLEX, ST ANDREW'S PLAIN, NORWICH WILL BE CLOSED FOR APPROX 1 YEAR FROM 2 JANUARY 2024 FOR EXTENSIVE REFURBISHMENT AND IMPROVEMENT

The Halls in Norwich, originally a 15th century friary, is one of the key venues for music, with a year-round programme of events, including regular organ recitals and concerts.

St. Andrew's Hall is the centrepiece of The Halls complex and is the name by which many people refer to the set of buildings. It has a fine, high-beamed ceiling, beautiful stained glass windows, limestone columns and a large polished maple floor. It was originally the nave of the friary and was completed in 1449. Many of the organisations in Music in Norwich programme hold their concerts in St Andrew's Hall, the largest part of the Halls complex.

The hall has been a mainstay in the Norfolk & Norwich Festival calendar since 1824, has hosted orchestras from Britten Sinfonia to the London Philharmonic Orchestra, and is the main residence for the Norwich Philharmonic Society as well as a regular venue for UEA Symphony and Chamber Orchestras and Choirs, Norwich Pops Orchestra and many others. It also hosts a regular array of performances by established jazz, brass, rock and pop acts and recently has also partnered with Norwich Arts Centre to enable bigger bands to come to Norwich.


